- ❖ **Thursday, October 11, 2018: *Mission Driven Global Programs***
Topics to consider: global models and program proposals, aligning programs to mission, learning goals and outcomes, mission match with in-country partners, selecting program leaders, expectation and communication
- ❖ **Thursday, November 8, 2018: *Integrating Global Learning Throughout the Curriculum***
Topics to consider: defining global competence, making the case for global learning throughout the curriculum, models for professional development and integration, examples of global learning through variety of disciplines (lower, middle, and upper), leveraging technology
- ❖ **Thursday, January 17, 2019: *Risk Management: Health and Safety for Global Programs***
Topics to consider: program development, vetting partners, parent and student preparation, program management (homebase and in situ), post travel reporting and follow-up
