❖ ***Tapping into Talent –faculty recruitment and retention***

Topics to consider: structure and organization of staff, hiring process, orientations, faculty meetings, leadership and professional development, evaluations

❖ ***Advising and Teaching Leadership***

Topics to consider: advisory programs, schedule and structure for advisory time, desired goals/outcomes, key topics, suggested materials/resources/speakers, leadership curricula and programs, opportunities to teach/model leadership throughout the day, week, and year, role of seniors, role of faculty, desired goals/outcomes, how to measure “success”

❖ ***Grading and Assessment***

Topics to consider: high school expectations, assessing project-based and collaborative work, considering effects of assessment on health and wellness, developing rubrics and alternative forms of assessment, peer-to-peer assessment, student-led conferences, creating portfolios

❖ ***Technology in the Classroom and Beyond***

Topics to consider: integrating technology across the curriculum, providing effective professional development, digital citizenship and online safety, cyberbullying, guidelines for online student behavior in and out of school

❖ ***Preparing for next steps: college and careers***

Topics to consider: college prep programs and pressures, internship and shadow day programs, balancing academics and extracurricular responsibilities, parent education
